


In honor of the Centennial of Thomas Merton

At Play in Creation: Merton's Awakening to the Feminine **Divine**, with Christopher Pramuk



Join author, theologian and musician, Chris Pramuk, for a unique celebration of the centennial of Thomas Merton's birth, exploring the beloved poet, peacemaker and mystic's transforming contemplation of Sophia, "mysterious Unity and Integrity...Wisdom...Mother of all...the Gift of my Creator's Thought and Art within me..." Pramuk's book, Sophia, the Hidden Christ of Thomas Merton, has been described by Merton's former secretary, Bro. Patrick Hart, as the best book ever written about Thomas Merton and was awarded the International Thomas Merton's Society's 2011 "Thomas Merton Award," its highest honor. At Play in Creation, released January 2015, invites us to join Merton and engage with Wisdom-Sophia through meditations on scripture, art, music and poetry, including Merton's poem, "Hagia Sophia." The new book's series of reflections will provide the framework for the weekend, which will include author presentations, conversation, time for individual reflection and a screening of the film, "Soul Searching: The Journey of Thomas Merton". He is the author of five books, including At Play in Creation: Merton's Awakening to the Feminine Divine (Liturgical, 2015), Hope Sings, So Beautiful: Graced Encounters Across the Color Line (Liturgical, 2013), and Sophia: The Hidden Christ of Thomas Merton (Liturgical, 2009), A lifelong musician and student of African American history and spirituality, his present work focuses on the healing of race relations in society and church.
